

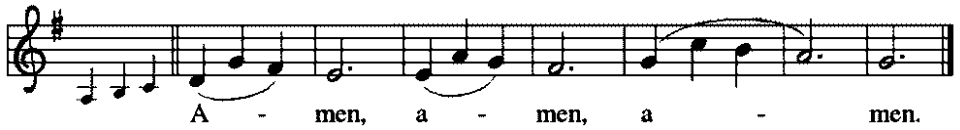
For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Pastor: Let us pray according to the words our Savior taught us:

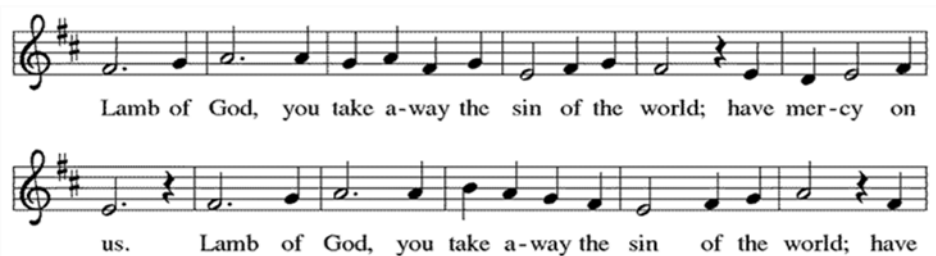


